- 302.3            ***Bullying***  
This guide looks at opposing viewpoints on various bullying issues. It also gives helpful information for writing the critical essay.
- 302.3 Dea        ***Dear Bully***  
Teen authors come together to share their personal stories about bullying, as silent observers, victims, and perpetrators.
- 302.34 Gar      ***Letters to a Bullied Girl: Messages of Healing and Hope***  
The true story of how two sisters initiated a letter writing campaign to lift the spirits of another girl who had been relentlessly bullied by classmates in a nearby community.
- PRO 302.5      ***Odd Girl Out: the Hidden Culture of Aggression in Girls***  
Every generation of women can tell stories of being bullied, but *Odd Girl Out* explores and explains these experiences for the first time.
- 305.235 Bur     ***Girls against Girls: Why We Are Mean to Each Other and How We Can Change***  
Explains why girls can sometimes be mean to each other, what victims of bullies can do, and the importance of treating other girls with respect.

Judge Tom Jacobs presents a powerful collection of landmark court cases involving teens and charges of cyberbullying.

- 362.2 Hud        ***Teen Suicide***  
Williams looks at a variety of topics within this emotional disorder, including the seriousness of the problem, whether tattoos and piercings count as deliberate self harm, what triggers the behavior, and what can be done to stop it. While self-mutilation doesn't seem to lend itself to the "Opposing Viewpoints" format, essays cover unexpected and hard-to-find stances such as "Not Acting on the Urge to Cut Is a Serious Problem" and "Cosmetic Surgery Boosts Self-Esteem." The discussions on cultural expectations are enlightening, as are the chapters on how best to assist those who feel the need to harm themselves. Researchers will find good, solid information here.

Discusses teen suicide, the warning signs, prevention and intervention, and coping with grief and loss after a suicide.
